Excavation

The tablets were excavated from Babylon during 1899–1917 by Robert Koldewey and were stored in a barrel-vaulted underground building consisting of rows of rooms near the Ishtar Gate.

Translation

he tablets' text states:

Babylon 20121: "...t[o] ia-'-u-kin, king..." Babylon 20178: "10 (sile of oil) to ...ba-'-kin, king of ia[...] 21/2 sile to (...so]ns of the king of ia-s-bu-dw Babylon 2010: '10 (sile) to Ia-ku-u-ki-ng, the son of the king of Ia-ku-du, 21/2 sile for the 5 sens of the king of Ia-ku-du?

Another tablet reads:

11/2 sils (oil) for three carpenters from Arvad, 1/2 spisos, 11/2 sils for sight woodworkers from Sphing, . . . 31/2 sils for seven Oreak craftman, 1/2 sils a to the carpenter, Nabuetir 10 sils to Is-kurw'hirun, the king of Judah's son, 21/2 sils for the fire rooms of the Judean King.



Weeping for Tammuz



רמחייע געמיין (**Γammuz** tam´uz, tam´mōōz (דמווי), *tammūz*; Θαμμούζ, *Thammoúz*):

(1) The name of a Phoenician deity, the Adonis of the Greeks. He was originally a Sumerian or Babylonian sun-god, called Dumuzu, the husband of Ishtar, who corresponds to Aphrodite of the Greeks. The worship of these deities was introduced into Syria in very early times under the designation of fammuz and Astarte, and appears among the Greeks in the myth of Adonis and Aphrodite, who are dentified with Osiris and Isis of the Egyptian pantheon, showing how widespread the cult became. The Babylonian myth represents Dumuzu, or Tammuz, as a beautiful shepherd slain by a wild boar, the symbol of winter. Ishtar long mourned for him and descended into the underworld to deliver him from he embrace of death (Frazer, Adonis, Attis and Osiris). This mourning for Tammuz was celebrated in Babylonia by wome on the 2nd day of the 4th month, which thus acquired the name of Tammuz (see ALENDAR). This custom of weeping for Tammuz is referred to in the Bible in the only passage where he name occurs (Eze 8:14). The chief seat of the cult in Syria was Gebal (modern *Geball*, Greek Bublos)

Cyrus allows the Jews to Return



- (1) In the first year of Cyrus king of Persia, that the word of the LORD by the mouth of Jeremiah might be fulfilled, the LORD stirred up the spirit of Cyrus king of Persia, so that he made a proclamation throughout all his kingdom and also put it in writing:
 - (2) "Thus says Cyrus king of Persia: The LORD, the God of heaven, has given me all the kingdoms of the earth, and he has charged me to build him a house at Jerusalem, which is in Judah.
 - (3) Whoever is among you of all his people, may his God be with him, and let him go up to Jerusalem, which is in Judah, and rebuild the house of the LORD, the God of Israel--he is the God who is in Jerusalem.

(4) And let each survivor, in whatever place he sojourns, be assisted by the men of his place with silver and gold, with goods and with beasts, besides freewill offerings for the house of God that is in Jerusalem."

- (4) The woman was arrayed in purple and scarlet, and adorned with gold and jewels and pearls, holding in her hand a golden cup full of abominations and the impurities of her sexual immorality.
- (5) And on her forehead was written a name of mystery: "<u>Babylon the great, mother of prostitutes and of earth's abominations</u>."

- **Babylon in Revelation**
 - Rev 18:1-4
 - (1) After this I saw another angel coming down from heaven, having great authority, and the earth was made bright with his glory.
 - (2) And he called out with a mighty voice, "Fallen, fallen is Babylon the great! She has become a dwelling place for demons, a haunt for every unclean spirit, a haunt for every unclean bird, a haunt for every unclean and detestable beast.
 - (3) For all nations have drunk the wine of the passion of her sexual immorality, and the kings of the earth have committed immorality with her, and the merchants of the earth have grown rich from the power of her luxurious living."
 - (4) Then I heard another voice from heaven saying,
 "Come out of her, my people, lest you take part in her sins, lest you share in her plagues;








• Jer 25:36-38

- (36) A voice--the cry of the shepherds, and the wail of the lords of the flock! For the LORD is laying waste their pasture,
- (37) and the peaceful folds are devastated because of the fierce anger of the LORD.
- (38) Like a lion he has left his lair, for their land has become a waste because of the sword of the oppressor, and because of his fierce anger."




- Jeremiah at the start of the reign of Jehoiakim spoke to the king of Judah (609 BC)
- They threatened to kill Jeremiah because he spoke against the city
- Uriah the prophet is killed by Jehoiakim
- Jeremiah is sparred by Ahikim



• Jer 26:1-5

- (1) In the beginning of the reign of Jehoiakim the son of Josiah, king of Judah, this word came from the LORD:
- (2) "Thus says the LORD: Stand in the court of the LORD's house, and speak to all the cities of Judah that come to worship in the house of the LORD all the words that I command you to speak to them; <u>do not hold</u> <u>back a word.</u>
- (3) It may be they will listen, and every one turn from his evil way, that I may relent of the disaster that I intend to do to them because of their evil deeds.
- (4) You shall say to them, 'Thus says the LORD: If you will not listen to me, to walk in my law that I have set before you,
- (5) and to listen to the words of my servants the prophets whom I send to you urgently, though you have not listened,






• Jer 26:6-9

 (6) then I will make this house like Shiloh, and I will make this city a curse for all the nations of the earth."

(7) The priests and the prophets and all the people heard Jeremiah speaking these words in the house of the LORD.


(8) And when Jeremiah had finished speaking all that the LORD had commanded him to speak to all the people, then the priests and the prophets and all the people laid hold of him, saying, "You shall die!

(9) Why have you prophesied in the name of the LORD, saying, 'This house shall be like Shiloh, and this city shall be desolate, without inhabitant'?" And all the people gathered around Jeremiah in the house of the LORD.



• Jer 26:10-13

- (10) When the officials of Judah heard these things, they came up from the king's house to the house of the LORD and took their seat in the entry of the New Gate of the house of the LORD.
- (11) Then the priests and the prophets said to the officials and to all the people, "This man deserves the sentence of death, because he has prophesied against this city, as you have heard with your own ears."
- (12) Then Jeremiah spoke to all the officials and all the people, saying, "The LORD sent me to prophesy against this house and this city all the words you have heard.
- (13) Now therefore mend your ways and your deeds, and obey the voice of the LORD your God, and the LORD will relent of the disaster that he has pronounced against you.



• Jer 26:14-17

- (14) But as for me, behold, I am in your hands. Do with me as seems good and right to you.
- (15) Only know for certain that if you put me to death, you will bring innocent blood upon yourselves and upon this city and its inhabitants, for in truth the LORD sent me to you to speak all these words in your ears."
- (16) Then the officials and all the people said to the priests and the prophets, "This man does not deserve the sentence of death, for he has spoken to us in the name of the LORD our God."
- (17) And certain of the elders of the land arose and spoke to all the assembled people, saying,

Mic 1:1-2

 (1) The word of the LORD that came to Micah of Moresheth in the days of Jotham, Ahaz, and Hezekiah, kings of Judah, which he saw concerning Samaria and Jerusalem.
 (2) Hear, you peoples, all of you; pay attention, O earth, and all that is in it, and let the Lord GOD be a witness against you, the Lord from his holy temple.



• Jer 26:18-20

- (18) "Micah of Moresheth prophesied in the days of Hezekiah king of Judah, and said to all the people of Judah: 'Thus says the LORD of hosts, "'Zion shall be plowed as a field; Jerusalem shall become a heap of ruins, and the mountain of the house a wooded height.'
- (19) Did Hezekiah king of Judah and all Judah put him to death? Did he not fear the LORD and entreat the favor of the LORD, and did not the LORD relent of the disaster that he had pronounced against them? But we are about to bring great disaster upon ourselves."
- (20) There was another man who prophesied in the name of the LORD, Uriah the son of Shemaiah from Kiriath-jearim. He prophesied against this city and against this land in words like those of Jeremiah.
